

SAFETY & AWARENESS REPORT –

Preparing for cold weather riding, check conditions before riding at 511.nebraska.gov. Always keep at least half tank of gas. Dress warm with layered clothing that doesn't restrict movement. And plan your route, stick to main roads, and let others know your destination and expected arrival time.

During wintertime consider indoor activities or possible short rides. Like museums: Stuhr Museum in Grand Island, Kool-Aid Museum in Hastings, and the Pioneer Village Museum in Minden.

Winterize and maintain your motorcycle: when not riding, prep motorcycles for storage, perform full service, change oil, clean chain, use fuel stabilizer. If possible, store motorcycles in a climate-controlled environment to protect from the elements.

I come from a family strong in the Military as I am sure many of you do to.



2026: A Compressed Calendar The Critical Next 13 Months

As the nation emerges from the longest government shutdown in history, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) is preparing for a fast-paced and politically charged 13-plus months in Washington, D.C. Midterm election years always bring a compressed congressional schedule. 2026 will be no exception. On average, the U.S. House of Representatives meets just 130 days in even-numbered years. The Senate averages 142, which is roughly three weeks fewer than in non-election years.

This condensed schedule means less time for Congress to legislate, debate, negotiate and even less time for groups like ours to ensure our priorities are heard. The 2025 government shutdown further reduced the year's "work days," leaving lawmakers with a backlog of unfinished business to address in the months ahead.

With razor-thin majorities in both chambers and Republicans maintaining narrow control, the political stakes will be high. The GOP will be under growing pressure to deliver tangible results before voters head to the polls in November. Reauthorization of the highway bill will be among the top priorities. It provides one of the most direct opportunities for both parties to advance their policy goals.

That's why sustained engagement by the MRF is more critical than ever. When Congress moves quickly, there's no time to introduce ourselves or educate new staff about our priorities. Success in these moments depends on preparation, relationships, reputation, and readiness built long before the legislative rush begins.

The MRF's government relations team continues active outreach with key committees, congressional offices, and regulatory agencies to ensure the voice of motorcyclists remains part of every relevant discussion. As these 13-plus months unfold, your involvement, your outreach, your stories, and your presence will be vital to securing the victories we need.

In a compressed political environment, preparation and persistence will determine success. By staying engaged and ready, the MRF and its members can continue to protect and advance the rights of all motorcyclists when opportunity strikes.

For many riders, the arrival of winter doesn't signal the end of the season—it simply marks a shift in strategy. Riding in cold weather can be exhilarating, but it also introduces a unique set of hazards: reduced traction, unpredictable weather, mechanical stress, and visibility challenges. With the right preparation and mindset, you can continue enjoying your bike year-round while staying safe. Here are essential winter motorcycle riding tips to keep you upright and protected.

1. Dress for the Weather: Layer Like a Pro

Cold temperatures can sap your concentration, slow your reaction time, and stiffen your muscles. Proper gear is one of the most important safety factors.

What to wear:

- •Base layer: moisture-wicking thermal underwear
- •Insulating layer: fleece or wool for warmth
- •Outer layer: a windproof, waterproof jacket and pants
- •Gloves: insulated, windproof, and preferably with heated liners
- •Boots: waterproof with good insulation and grip
- •Helmet: full-face with a fog-resistant visor or Pinlock insert

Tip: Consider heated gear (jacket liner, gloves, grips, socks). It's a game-changer for comfort and safety.

2. Prep Your Bike for Cold Weather

Winter puts additional strain on your motorcycle. Make sure it's ready to handle it.

Check these items:

- •Tires: Choose winter-appropriate rubber if possible. Ensure tread depth is well above minimum and check tire pressure often—cold temperatures lower PSI.
- •Battery: Cold weakens batteries. Keep it fully charged and consider a trickle charger at home.
- •Fluids: Use winter-grade oil if your manufacturer specifies. Ensure coolant is appropriate for freezing temps.
- •Lights: Shorter days mean more night riding—verify all lights are bright and functional.
- •Chain & lubrication: Cold weather thickens and stiffens lube, so keep the chain well maintained.

3. Ride Smoothly and Predictably

Winter riding is all about traction management.

Key habits:

- •Accelerate gently to avoid spinning the rear tire.
- •Brake smoothly and early. Use both brakes with lighter pressure.
- •Lean less in corners. Keep the bike more upright and reduce speed.
- •Increase following distance. Aim for 4–6 seconds, more if roads are wet or icy.

4. Watch for Invisible Hazards

The biggest winter danger is what you don't see until it's too late.

High-risk areas:

- •Shaded corners where ice lingers all day
- •Bridge decks that freeze sooner
- •Leaves that become slippery when damp
- •Black ice, which often looks like wet pavement
- •Sand and gravel used by road crews

Rule of thumb: If the temperature is below 40°F (4°C) and the pavement looks "wet," assume it may be ice.

5. Improve Your Visibility

Drivers already struggle to see motorcycles—winter conditions make it worse.

Make yourself stand out:

- •Wear bright or reflective gear.
- •Add reflective tape to your helmet or panniers.
- •Use auxiliary lights or fog lights when possible.
- •Keep your visor clean inside and out to reduce glare and fog.

6. Stay Warm to Stay Sharp

Cold reduces mental clarity, and that can lead to mistakes.

Stay alert by:

- •Taking breaks to warm up on long rides
- •Keeping a small thermos of hot drink in your luggage
- Using heated grips or bar muffs
- Avoiding prolonged exposure if windchill becomes extreme

Remember: Numb hands mean slower reactions.

7. Know When Not to Ride

One of the smartest winter-riding skills is recognizing when conditions are too dangerous.

Avoid riding if:

- Snow is actively falling
- •Roads have not yet been plowed or salted
- •Temperatures drop rapidly after rain (flash freeze risk)
- Strong crosswinds make control difficult
- •Visibility is poor due to fog or blowing snow

Your safety is worth more than any ride.

Final Thoughts

Winter motorcycle riding can be rewarding—quiet roads, crisp air, stunning landscapes—but only if approached with caution and preparation. With the right gear, a properly maintained bike, and mindful riding techniques, you can enjoy the colder months safely.

Stay warm, stay visible, and above all, stay safe out there.

What to Include in a Motorcycle Trauma Kit

- 1. Sterile gauze pads and bandages for wound dressing.
- 2. Adhesive tape.
- 3. Tourniquets or compression bandages.

SHARE THE ROAD is a motorcycle awareness program that promotes driver awareness and increases understanding of how motorcycles behave in traffic. ABATE of Nebraska, Inc. provides trained volunteers to present this program to the public. We believe that education and training are the best ways to prevent, and thereby reduce, motorcycle/automobile accidents.

Research shows that three fourths of crashes involving a motorcycle also involves another motor vehicle, which is usually at fault. Considering crash statistics and the increasing number of motorcyclists, the key to a safer riding mix is learning to SHARE THE ROAD.

Motorcycles are very different from automobiles - they are much smaller in size & are harder to see then automobiles. The failure of motorists to see motorcyclists in traffic is the most common cause of crashes. Car drivers who are involved in an accident with a motorcycle often do not see the motorcycle prior to the crash, or until it is too late to avoid having the crash.

The greatest risk area for a conflict between a motorcycle and a automobile is at an intersection...whether it is in the middle of an urban area, a driveway on a residential street, or anywhere where traffic may cross your path of travel. Over one half of motorcycle/car crashes are caused by drivers

entering a rider's right-of-way. Cars that turn left in from of motorcyclists, including cars turning left from the lane to the right, and cars on side streets that pull into the motorcyclists lane are the biggest dangers.

The fact remains.....the best way to prevent any accident is through Education, Safety, and Motorcycle Awareness Programs like SHARE THE ROAD.




